Nature Play Spaces

Seed Classroom



In March, Manager Jen Scully presented the SEED Classroom project at the Maryland State Senate in Annapolis for Bond Bill Saturday, where she sought funding. A bond bill for education is a piece of state legislature that, if passed, will provide funds for capital projects at institutions throughout the state. The SEED project was fortunate to be awarded a \$150,000 bond!

A grant from Sun Group, a Texas energy company, has been awarded to the project and is in the final stages of negotiation with Montgomery Parks and the Parks Foundation.

Park staff are working hard to prepare a presentation for the County Council on the project to receive Capital Improvement Project (CIP) funds.

And finally, a consultant has been hired to work on engineering plans for the site.

Native Plant Sale Results

The plant sale was held April 25-28, 2019. It is our big fundraiser...our main event...the one that helps to support the Nature Programs.

The sale was a huge success and exceeded all of our expectations, and previous year's totals.

We had a gross profit of almost \$20,000 (which included new memberships). The net profit for 2018 was \$12,600.



Camp Scholarships

The Friends supported two Marvin Kahn Summer Camp Scholarships for the 2019 camp season. They were awarded to a local boy and girl, both of whom had wonderful applications.

The boy will attend the Nature Child Camp from July 29 through August 7 and the girl will attend the Nature Girl Camp from August 5-9.
