## NATIVE PLANT SALE

In late January, a few gardeners received bag stratification lessons at the Pope Farm Nursery in Gaithersburg.

In horticulture, stratification is a process of treating seeds to simulate natural conditions that the seeds must experience before germination can occur.

The gardeners met in early February to stratify seeds for perennial plants that will be grown for our Annual 2019 Native Plant Sale.

Pope Farm's molo is "Qui Planlavil Curabit" which means, "He who plants, preserves."

# ROAD CLOSURE

As of the end of January, northern access to the Black Hill Regional Park from the intersection of Clarksburg Road (MD-121) and West Old Baltimore Road closed to traffic. The road will remain closed for approximately 14-18 months, for paving, grading and excavating. During this time, vehicles will not be able to gain access to the Park. All vehicles will need to detour from Clarksburg Road (MD-121) to Route 355-South.

#### CAUSEWAY RENOVATION PROJECT

The Causeway Regional Project on Black Hill Road that crosses Little Seneca Lake started in early December and will end by February 28. Montgomery Parks has replaced the old culvert pipe infrastructure and Black Hill Road causeway. For ease of maintenance, the water level on the lake was lowered at the dam, which caused a rather substantial beach to appear at the lake shore, bringing in a flock of seagulls to pick and scatter shells. The new pipes are more centrally located within the causeway and at completion of the project, the road will be repaved. During this time, the adjacent boat ramp will not be accessible.
